RESOLUTION

- AREREAS: During the early days of Persident Franklin D. Roosevelt's administration, a promise was given and a ruling made and a precedent followed wherein all new employees to be hired by the Sureau of Indian Affairs were to be native American Indians, sole preference being given to them, and
- WHEREAS: There are, at this time, hundreds, yea thousands of well qualified, competent, capable Indians, as to education, temperment, experience and ambition, both male and female, desperately in need of employment, and
- WHEREAS: The American Indian seems to be overlooked or is the forgotten man on employment by the United States Government at this time.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Creek Indian Council of the Creek Nation, located in Oklahoma meeting in regular session assembled respectfully request and urge a continuance of the policy of giving preference in employment by the Bureau of Indian Affairs to the American Indian, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Hon. Stuart Udall, Secretary of the Interior, a copy to the Hon. Phillio Nash, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, a copy to the Hon. Virgil N. Harrington, a REA Director, Muskogee, Okla., a copy to United States Senators Mike Monroney and J. Howard Edmondson and a copy to Congressmen Tom Steed, Ed Edmondson and Page Belcher. A copy for the minutes of the meeting.
