Don: Mr. Frank Hutchinson of the Bureau of Indian Affairs called today about S. 1546. He wanted to know what the intent and purpose of the bill was. In this connection he mentioned two previous statutes, which are listed below: 1. Act of March 4, 1923, 42 Stat. 1448, which authorized the Secretary of Interior to lease "lands and oil and gas deposits, belonging to the United States and situated south of the medial line of main channel of Red River, Oklahoma." 2. Act of June 12, 1926, 44 Stat. 740, which authorized the Secretary of Interior to establish a trust fund for Kiowa, Comanche, and Apache Indians in Oklahoma, and to place in such fund the moneys received from leases granted under the March 4, 1923 Act. (37 1/2% of the royalties from such leases "shall be paid to the State of Oklahoma in lieu of State and local taxes upon said tribal funds.") Hutchinson stated that the lands covered under S. 1546 could already be leased under the Act of March 4, 1923. He also wanted to know whether these two previous acts would be superseded by S. 1546, if it were enacted.
