A vital issue is at stake in the
Kiowa-Comanche-Apache Tribes. We wish to
make an appeal in declaring legal a
~~General Council meeting~~ held at Apache,
Okla. January 19, 1963.

At this meeting, we ousted our Business
Committee, which has a criminal element
also our tribal Constitution which is out-
of-date, worthless and unworkable. No
one knows this better than Mr. Philes
Nash, our Commissioner.

There is no question of the legality of our
meeting. It was completely in line and
badly needed in order to have a new
constitution. We wish to stabilize our
tribal government and to improve the general
welfare of our three tribes.

We need your support and influence
in this important matter.
