This is in reply to your inquiry about disposition of the judgment funds in Dockets 67, 124-A and 251.

Funds to pay these judgments were provided for in a supplemental appropriations bill passed by the Congress in May. Legislation to authorize distribution of the funds is now being drafted by the Bureau of Indian Affairs. It will be introduced in the near future, and I know of no reason why it will not be enacted in the regular order of business.


Dear Senator Monroney:
