I have been one of your supporters for many years and have followed with interest your very successful career.

Nearing retirement age, I recently made a check-up of my small resources and ran across a problem in connection with which I am hopeful I may prevail upon you for an assist. The situation is this: I am a 1/32nd Cherokee Indian and as such was supposed to be allotted 90 acres of land - a 30-acre homestead and a 50-acre surplus, plus a 10-acre fraction. However, deeds were issued to me for only 80 acres. I never received a deed for the 10-acre fraction.

A Field Representative of the Five Civilized Tribes Agency furnished me with the following information, which is all I have been able to secure at this end:
