Thank you for your letter stating that Joe Stockton, a student at Chilocco Indian School, is deserving of any aid or scholarship which might be bestowed upon him.

I appreciate your interest in helping and encouraging students who show promise. The Federal Government has no program for assisting high school students either financially or through scholarships. However, there is a program whereby college students may obtain long-term loans at low rates of interest.

If Joe is in need for financial assistance in completing his high school education, you may wish to call his case to the attention of the appropriate Indian Agency. In some instances, help is available through that source, and I would be happy to investigate the possibilities for Joe if you will provide me with more complete information on him and his problem.
