In reviewing the Full Committee Print of the Department of the Interior and Related Agencies Appropriation Bill, 1974, I note page 38, which was marked for my attention; and in reviewing the information contained on this page there appears a Line Item of \$500,000 to be used in the construction of Health Centers in Hugo, McAlester, and Eufaula, Oklahoma. Apparently, the committee overlooked including an Item for staffing these Health Centers which should include approximately 50 to 55 staff members.

The Director of the Division of Indian Health can give you the exact amount that should have been included in this appropriation, which I sincerely hope can be corrected before finalization of the appropriation by the Department of the Interior and Related Agencies.

The situation is this: If an appropriation is not made for the salaries of a staff to man these centers, we will not be able to use them upon their completion until the appropriation is made for staffing.

I am sure we can count on your understanding and help in getting this Item corrected, as I feel that there is time for this to be done before final passage of the Appropriation Bill for 1974.
