R E S O L U T I O N

On the 27th day of January, 1951, the Choctaw Indian Citizens of the Choctaw Council of Talihina, Oklahoma, held a meeting in Talihina for the purpose of discussing the delay of payments to the heirs of the deceased allottees. After a lengthy discussion of the situation, the following resolution was passed:

WHEREAS, The Choctaw-Chickasaw Indians, have been waiting eighteen months or more for their claims to be paid. As we were requested to refrain from writing to the Muskogee Office for information, Many of us have complied with that ruling. Others are very anxious about the matter and are in need of more information, or really what they want now is the money due them.

THEREFORE, WE, THE CHOCTAW INDIANS, REQUEST THAT:

1. A correspondence section be set up in the Per Capita payment division, to answer inquiries of the Indians, and to give the name of the deceased allottees, from whom the claim is paid, when checks are mailed.
2. And, be it further resolved, that, when an heirship application is filed that the claim be paid at once. We think it is unfair to delay paying claims, because some of the other heirs cannot be found and are not known, whether living or dead.
3. We suggest also that this same procedure be followed in processing other pending claims and future payments, that will be coming due soon.
4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE ORIGINAL OF THIS RESOLUTION BE SENT TO;

Dear Mrs. Andrews:

Thank you for your letter of January 18 and the enclosed resolution adopted by a number of Indians who recently met at Hugo.

I do not blame you people for being upset and discouraged over the manner in which the Muskogee Office is making payment to the Choctaw and Chickasaw Indians for their dead claims. This thing has caused more criticism than anything I have ever had any contact with in my life. I am sure that I have seen Mr. Roberts as well as the Commissioner's office here in Washington more than a dozen times on this matter and that I have written hundreds of letters. They have promised recently that they would start mailing out these known heirship claims, which are causing the main difficulty, to the last known address. If they do that they can solve what has been the principle problem in this slowness. If they don't follow through on this, we are going to see them again about it and try to get an explanation as to why they are not doing it.

Dear Sir:

Enclosed you will find a copy of a resolution passed by a number of Choctaw Indians, Saturday, January 13, 1951.

This was a protest meeting, you might say. We are all tired of the slowness of payment on dead claims. I think we have been very patient in as much as responsible people have been to Muskogee and returned saying the ones supposed to be working on this spent more time in the halls than they did working and one man went up there and there was only one girl in that section and she told them they rest of them "went fishing".

We realize that these are civil service employees and have to please no one but their particular boss, but after all they are working for us and we think they have shown very little efficiency. The time to organize a department is when it is set up and not afterwards. Twice this department has stopped payments to "re-organize".

The department may push us around but that doesn't say we have to like it and we really don't.

Anything you can do to facilitate the paying of these dead claims will be appreciated.

I could live if I never got mine, I have a job, but many of the Indians are in actual need.

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, on the 13th day of January, 1951, the Choctaw Indians held a meeting in Hugo, in the District Court Room and the purpose of the meeting being to discuss the slowness of the Department in paying the claims against the estates of deceased Indians. After a general discussion, the following resolution was passed.

WHEREAS, a great many of the Choctaw-Chickasaw Indians have not received any of their dead claims and many Indians have passed away without receiving payment, and;

WHEREAS, it is winter and many of the Indians are in need of immediate assistance, and;

WHEREAS, we are told that another payment is due the Indians in the near future and although the fifty-thousand dollars for administrative purposes is practically exhausted, there still remains some ten thousand claims to be processed and paid, and;

WHEREAS, no acknowledgement of any claim is made when received by the Department; the Indians have no way of knowing whether their claim was received or not and we have had to resort to writing our Congressmen and our Chief in order to ascertain if the claims were received.

WE, THEREFORE, RESPECTFULLY REQUEST:

I.

That before the next payment is started that a correspondence section be set up in the Per Capita Payment Section and that all Proofs of Heirships be acknowledged when received and the inquiries of the Indians answered within a reasonable time and that when checks are mailed out, we have something to show on whom payment was made. As it is now handled, we have no way of knowing which claim was paid and which was not.

II.

That sufficient help be employed before the work is started to hasten the processing of claims and that such help be required to give a full eight hours of work for which they are paid and that the "organization" be done first and not after the work starts, as has happened during this payment, when all processing ceased twice for "re-organization". That before the next payment is started that a correspondence section be set up in the Per Capita Payment Section and that all Proofs of Heirships be acknowledged when received and the inquiries of the Indians answered within a reasonable time and that when checks are mailed out, we have something to show on whom payment was made. As it is now handled, we have no way of knowing which claim was paid and which was not.

II.

That sufficient help be employed before the work is started to hasten the processing of claims and that such help be required to give a full eight hours of work for which they are paid and that the "organization" be done first and not after the work starts, as has happened during this payment, when all processing ceased twice for "re-organization". We think the department should function more efficiently than that.

III.

We further protest the departmental policy of holding up all payments until the address of an absentee heir is ascertained, in as much as Indians, as well as whites, have a way of leaving without furnishing an address and some of them have been gone so long they could be legally declared dead, yet, the department penalizes all the other heirs if the delinquent heir is not found. We think the department

should hold the absentee heirs share in trust and pay the other heirs.

Reference is to your letter of January 29, 1951 pertaining to copies of the resolutions sent you by the "Choctaw Indian Council" of McCurtain County and the Choctaw Indians at Hugo, Oklahoma. There is no such organization, this being a list of solicited names.

However, every effort is being made to complete this payment as speedily as is consistent with sound decision and payments are being made as fast as determinations are completed. We regret that a few difficult cases have been dramatized for purposes not likely to be helpful in getting facts on which to make determination.

The Commissioner has recently authorized this office to make payment in certain cases of partial determination. This probably will free some claims which we have not been able to pay heretofore.

Copies of these resolutions were sent to the Muskogee Office.

It does appear that some method could be worked out whereby those who can prove to be rightful heirs could be paid. Also, it does seem that the requests made in paragraphs I, II, and III of these resolutions, could be carried out.

Many of these aged Indians are passing on before ever receiving settlement of their claims, and on the face of it, it would appear that the process would have to start all over again before settlement could be made.

I would certainly appreciate your doing everything you can toward carrying out the suggestions outlined in these resolutions and advising me accordingly.

WHEREAS, on the 24th day of January, 1951, the Choctaw Indian Citizens of the Choctaw Council of McCurtain County, Oklahoma, held a meeting in Idabel, Oklahoma, and the purpose of the meeting being to discuss the slowness of the Indian Department in paying the claims against the estates of Deceased Allettees. And, after a general discussion the following resolution was passed.

WHEREAS, a great many of the Choctaw-Chickasaw Indians have not received any of their claims from deceased Indian estates, and many Indians have passed away without receiving payment, and;

WHEREAS, It is winter and many of the Indians are in great need of immediate assistance, and;

WHEREAS, We are told that another payment is due the Indians in the near future, although the Fifty-five thousand dollars for administrative purposes is practically exhausted, there still remains some ten thousand claims to be processed and paid, and ;

WHEREAS, no acknowledgement of any claims is made when received by the Department; the Indians have no way of knowing whether their claim was received or not, and we have had to resort to writing our Congressmen and our Chief in order to ascertain if the claims were received.

WE THEREFORE RESPECTFULLY REQUEST:

I

Before next payment is started that a correspondence section be set up in the Per capita Payment Division and the proofs of heirship furnished be acknowledged when received and the inquiries of the Indians be answered within a reasonable time and when checks are mailed out, we have something to show on whom payment was made. As it is now handled, we have no way of knowing which claim was paid and which was not.

II

That sufficient help be employed before work is started to hasten the processing of claims and that such help be required to give a full eight hours work for which they are paid and that the "Organization" be done first and not after the work starts as has happened during this payment when all processing ceased twice for "Re-organization". We think the Department should function more efficiently than that.

III.

We further protest the departmental policy of holding up all payments until the address of an absentee heir is ascertained in as much as Indians, as well as whites have went away of leaving without furnishing an address and some of them have been gone so long

to discuss the slowness of the Indian Department in paying the claims against the estates of Deceased Allottees. And after a general discussion the following resolution was passed.

WHEREAS, a great many of the Choctaw-Chickasaw Indians have not received any of their claims from deceased Indian estates, and many Indians have passed away without receiving payment, and;

WHEREAS, It is winter and many of the Indians are in great need of immediate assistance, and;

WHEREAS, We are told that another payment is due the Indians in the near future, although the Fifty-five thousand dollars for administrative purposes is practically exhausted, there still remains some ten thousand claims to be processed and paid, and ;

WHEREAS, no acknowledgement of any claims is made when received by the Department; the Indians have no way of knowing whether their claim was received or not, and we have had to resort to writing our Congressmen and our Chief in order to ascertain if the claims were received.

WE THEREFORE RESPECTFULLY REQUEST:

I

Before next payment is started that a correspondence section be set up in the Per capita Payment Division and the proofs of Heirship furnished be acknowledged when received and the inquiries of the Indians be answered within a reasonable time and when checks are mailed out, we have something to show on whom payment was made. As it is now handled, we have no way of knowing which claim was paid and which was not.

II

That sufficient help be employed before work is started to hasten the processing of claims and that such help be required to give a full eight hours work for which they are paid and that the "Organization" be done first and not after the work starts as has happened during this payment when all processing ceased twice for "Re-organization". We think the Department should function more efficiently than that.

III.

We further protest the departmental policy of holding up all payments until the address of an absentee heir is ascertained in as much as Indians, as well as whites have ~~went~~ away of leaving without furnishing an address and some of them have been gone so long they could be legally declared dead, yet the department penalizes the other heirs if the delinquent is not found. We think the Department should hold the absentees share in trust, and pay the other heirs.
