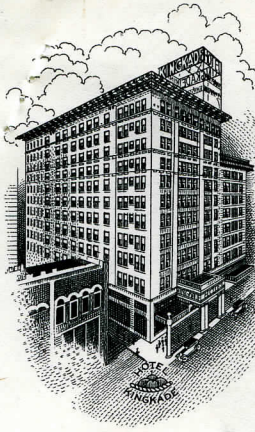
This will acknowledge receipt of your letter in which you ask if the next per capita payment will be made before Christmas.

We trust this answers the questions you had in mind. If we can be of any further service from the Congressman's Washington office, please let us know.

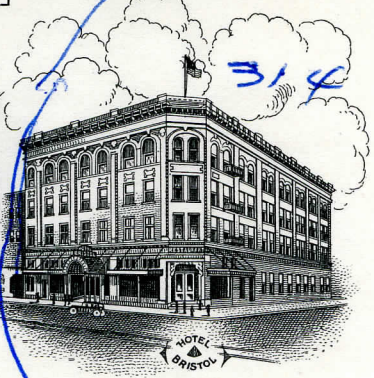

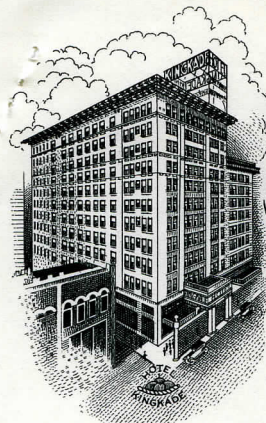

this information you can

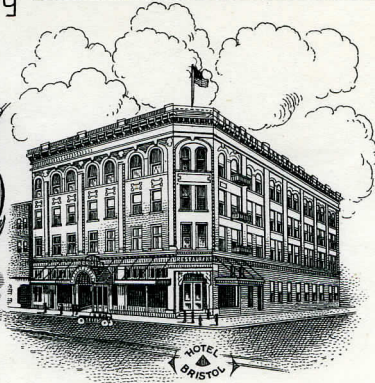
