He said the Public Health Service in these programs now and was working closely with him and the Indians ~~in working out the sex~~ everything is going fine.

I suggested that Dr. Bailey or Dr. Robertson go to Antlers and talk with the people about the situation and see what could be worked out. Dr. Bailey promised to call John Hicks and go over to see him today.

Dr. Robertson called me from Oklahoma City to say they were going to work this out...and they hoped it would be to our complete satisfaction. He said Calvin Beames, his executive officer, advised they should put the nurse back on duty full time at Antlers. He said if that's what it takes, he'll do it. Calvin is in Utah or would go in himself to check on situation.

If you get a chance, Chief Belvin would like for you to call him. I told him we weren't upset at all about the situation and were satisfied it could be worked ~~out~~ out. He said he had had only one complaint from a woman who is married to an Indian. When Chief Belvin explained everything to her, she was satisfied, he said.

I believe everything is under control on this. Dr. Robertson wants to do the right thing and I believe it will work out.

Incidentally, Mrs. Belvin had a heart attack 3 weeks ago and is in Durant hospital. We sent her a "get well" wire yesterday. She's getting along o.k.

John Hicks, Antlers, and Stuart B. Halley, Halley Drug Co., Antlers, both called 10-20-67 to complain about a reduction in services being offered by Public Health Service, Division of Indian Health, in Antlers and Pushmataha county.

It seems that the ~~In Public~~ Health Service had contracted with a local physician Dr. A. W. Haddox, to provide medical services for Indians in that area. Now that is being withdrawn and a medical doctor will be sent in only one day a week and a licensed practical nurse one day a week, the doctor on ~~Friday~~ Wednesday and the nurse on Friday.

Heretofore, ~~there~~ a clerk had been on duty in the office every day.

~~What next~~

At the same time, PHS is reducing services in Pushmataha county, it is inaugurating services in Broken Bow and Idabel. Clinics will be held in Broken Bow from 10 to 12 Mondays and Thursdays and in Idabel from 1 to 3 on Mondays and Thursdays.

Indians of area will suffer from this reduction, both callers pointed out.

CLW explained about economy move which is now on. Both of these men felt we should economize elsewhere and not in services to ~~people~~ our poor Indians.

Mr. Halley said he had talked with Joe Anderson and was trying to call Jimmy Belvin.

He was irate. He admitted he had a little selfish interest in that his drug business would be effected but he said his main concern ~~is~~ was for the Indians.

ANALYSIS OF CONTRACT MEDICAL CARE COST INCREASES
Comparison of Fiscal Years 1967 and 1968

A summary analysis of DIH contract medical care cost increases by Area in hospitalization and physicians services is attached. Also attached is a table by each line item (hospitalization, travel, professional field supervision, physicians' services, dental services and other) comparing 1968 fund availability to 1968 revised requirements based on 1967 experience. This summary analysis indicates that the Division has experienced 10.9% increase in the cost of hospital care and an 18% increase in physicians fees to date in F.Y. 1968 as compared to F.Y. 1967.

These increased costs in hospitalization and physician fees have actually been experienced. Additional cost increases in 1968, however, are a certainty since a number of major hospital vendors have not completed their F.Y. 1967 audits and, therefore, their new contracts for F.Y. 1968 have not been negotiated. Contracts now in the process of negotiation are anticipated to generate an additional fund requirement in excess of one hundred thousand dollars.

In addition, hospital contracts are subject to renegotiation at 6 month intervals and a number of Areas report that they have been notified by the contract hospitals to expect increased rates. Based on past experience, we would anticipate at least another 10% increase in hospital costs during the present fiscal year.

The impact of titles XVIII and XIX of the Social Security Act are reflected in the F.Y. 1967 figures. The only new program implemented in F.Y. 1968 that will have significant impact on the DIH program is in Montana. It is estimated that this program will reduce DIH contract medical care demands by approximately \$75,000. New programs are planned for South Dakota and Wyoming but are not yet implemented. Their impact cannot be determined at this time.

To finance the additional amount of funds needed in 1968 for contract medical care from other activities would mean that a large percentage of new Hospital and Field positions provided in the 1968 appropriation could not be funded. Absorptions in the 1968 program are already taking place. A preliminary analysis of 1967 costs indicates that the increased cost for drugs, medicines, laundry, other supplies and other services has resulted in the support of less man years in 1967 than anticipated. This deficit in unfundable man years due to unbudgeted increased costs will have to be carried into the 1968 operation. An additional decrease in the 1968 program will be required if the Division is forced to absorb 1968 W/B increases and higher nurse salaries recently approved by the Civil Service Commission.

Conclusion

Based on the foregoing, and the attached schedules additional contract medical care funds in the total amount of \$1,650,560 are required in 1968 in order to maintain the program at the 1967 level.
