Mr. Martin explained he was in school with Cong. Albert and saw him while he was in Okla. City recently.

He is a member of the Osage Indian Tribe and is a member of the Council. He explained that there is a final judgment of better than \$13⁺ million in a land claim cases. He pointed out the fact that this amount would have to be in the budget and then go to the White House. After this, it would come back to the House attached to a Deficiency or Supplemental Appropriation bill.

He was very anxious for us to make certain it was in the budget and ready for the House to act upon when they returned from the recess on November 16. Said Congressman Edmondson had been contacted and was doing what he could but he felt Mr. Albert could get it in the budget. CLW kept telling him over and over that we would do what we could and suggested that he also contact Senator Bellmon which he said he would do but he wanted to make sure Mr. Albert tried to get it in the budget. CLW reiterated he would be glad to do the best he could.

THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

SIR: I ask the Congress to consider proposed supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year 1971 in the amounts of \$8,975,000 for the Legislative and Judicial Branches, and \$41,747,738 to pay claims and judgments rendered against the United States which this Government has the tradition of honoring promptly.

The details of these proposed appropriations are set forth in the enclosed letter from the Office of Management and Budget. I concur in the comments and observations contained in that letter.

Sir: I have the honor to submit for your consideration proposed supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year 1971 in the amounts of \$8,975,000 for the Legislative and Judicial Branches and \$41,747,738 to pay claims and judgments rendered against the United States, as provided by various laws, together with such indefinite amounts as may be necessary to pay interest as follows:

LEGISLATIVE BRANCH

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

SALARIES, OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

Committee Employees

For an additional amount for "Committee employees", \$625,000.

Office of the Legislative Counsel

For an additional amount for "Office of the Legislative Counsel", \$43,000.

CONTINGENT EXPENSES OF THE HOUSE

Miscellaneous Items

For an additional amount for "Miscellaneous items", \$680,000.

GOVERNMENT PRINTING OFFICE

OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT OF DOCUMENTS

For an additional amount for "Salaries and expenses", \$265,000.

As required by law, this supplemental request for the Legislative Branch is submitted without change.

THE JUDICIARY

COURTS OF APPEALS, DISTRICT COURTS, AND OTHER JUDICIAL SERVICES

FEES AND EXPENSES OF COURT-APPOINTED COUNSEL

For an additional amount for "Fees and expenses of court-appointed counsel", \$6,700,000: *Provided, That not to exceed \$1,000,000 shall be available for the liquidation of obligations incurred in the prior year.*

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE UNITED STATES COURTS

For an additional amount for "Administrative Office of the United States Courts", \$60,000.

COMMISSION ON BANKRUPTCY LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES
SALARIES AND EXPENSES

For expenses necessary to carry out the provisions of the Joint Resolution of July 24, 1970 (Public Law 91-354) (84 Stat. 463), \$600,000, to be derived from the Referees' Salary and Expense Fund, established pursuant to section 406(4) of the Bankruptcy Act (11 U.S.C. 68(c)(4)), such amount to remain available until expended.

As required by law, these appropriation requests for the Judiciary are submitted without change.

CLAIMS AND JUDGMENTS

For payment of claims settled and determined by departments and agencies in accord with law and judgments rendered against the United States by the United States Court of Claims and United States district courts, as set forth in House Document Numbered _____, Ninety-first Congress, \$41,747,738, together with such amounts as may be necessary to pay interest (as and when specified in such judgments or provided by law) and such additional sums due to increases in rates of exchange as may be necessary to pay claims in foreign currency: *Provided, That no judgment herein appropriated for shall be paid until it shall become final and conclusive against the United States by failure of the parties to appeal or otherwise: Provided further, That unless otherwise specifically required by law or by judgment, payment of interest wherever appropriated for herein shall not continue for more than thirty days after the date of approval of the act.*

The details of the proposed supplemental appropriation for claims and judgments are covered in the letters from the various departments and agencies set forth in the attachment to this letter.

In accordance with the provisions of law providing for this submission, I recommend that these proposed supplemental appropriations be transmitted to the Congress.
