

Dear Senator Bartlett:

Please let the record show our response to freshman Congressman Ted Risenhoover, 2ND District (Democrat) allegations of mismanagement and discrimination. We are enclosing for the record a letter from Mr. Leonard Chaires, Assistant Regional Administrator for Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity, Dallas Region VI. is self explanatory. The Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority of the Cherokee Nation of Oklahoma carefully considered project sites and design criteria before selecting IBEC Housing Company of Oklahoma as Developer. The Board follows this procedure in every case when accepting or rejecting proposals for housing development; development cost is not the primary criteria for Developer selection and no discrimination was intended by the Board in rejecting K & T Construction Company.

Congressman Risenhoovers allegations of mismanagement by the Cherokee Nation Housing Authority is completely unfounded and it is apparent that his information sources are unreliable. It is regrettable that a U.S. Congressman must lower his priorities to the level of attacking a struggling Indian Housing Authority trying to house it's people. Whatever his motives or motives of his advisors, the Cherokee Nation Housing Program is the largest and most successful Indian Housing Program in the Nation. We are proud of our achievements and welcome inspection by the Department of Housing and Urban Development or the general public.

Your letter of May 27, 1975, addressed to Mr. Robert H. Breeden, Director of HUD Area Office, Oklahoma City, has been forwarded to the Regional Office of HUD, Dallas, Texas.

Executive Order 11246 dated September 24, 1965, and subsequent amendments, provided as a condition for approval that the applicant for Federal assistance involving a construction contract undertakes and agrees to incorporate the provisions prescribed for Government contracts by Section 202 of said order, Paragraphs one to seven. it provides that the authorized areas of discrimination are because of race, religion, color, national origin or sex.

In your complaint there does not appear to be jurisdictional remedy under Executive Order 11246 since it is stated in your letter that: "We believe that we were discriminated against in this project due to the political power of IBEC."

In view of the above the Assistant Secretary has determined not to accept your complaint because of lack of jurisdiction.
