Tou refer to Plan No. 1 of the President, with reference to National Housing, etc., and you request me to vote against approval of the President's Reorganization Plan No. 1.


This question was under consideration in the House one day last week, and I am happy to tell you that I voted against the plan and the House turned it down by a substantial majority.

Dear Congressman Schwabe:

The Chamber of Commerce of the United States has recently called our attention to the re-organization plans of President Truman.

They refer particularly to Plan No. 1 which sets up the National Housing Agency as a separate governmental bureau and gives it control over the Federal Housing Administration and the Federal Home Loan Bank System.

The National Housing Agency is a war-time agency and was supposed to end with the termination of the war. The Federal Housing Administration and the Federal Home Loan Bank System were pre-war agencies and have done outstanding work. I feel that these two agencies can well handle any work that the National Housing Agency is now doing; consequently, we ask that you disapprove Plan No. 1 and support the plan that will eliminate the National Housing Agency and put the entire housing problem back to the Federal Housing Administration and the Federal Home Loan Bank System.
