Dear Mr. Chandler:

I am happy to acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 24th expressing your views on H.R. 2788 and S. 760.

I am constantly voting and working for every measure that I believe will tend to loosen the stranglehold of the bureaucrats upon our people; and insofar as these measures tend in that direction you may rest assured that I am wholeheartedly for them.

Many measures are introduced which are couched in such cunning language that their real purpose is obscured. We have gotten into a very critical position in this country as a result of the surrender of the rights of the people to the bureaucrats. Congress granted these bureaus unusual and exclusive powers, and now we find the bureaucrats clinging tenaciously to every vestige of power that was surrendered to them, and they are attempting to tell Congress what to do. Just think of the creature telling the creator what to do! It is always easier to surrender the rights of the people than it is to recapture them. It requires only a bare majority of a quorum of the two Houses to surrender these liberties; but it requires a two-thirds vote to override the veto of the President to measures seeking to retrieve these rights.

Again I assure you of my appreciation of your letter, and trust you will continue to let me have your views on vital current issues, and that you will not be disappointed in my attitude toward and vote upon any measures of this sort.

Pending such a day, we think any measure that will tend to modify the potential damage that may result from its operation should be encouraged.


There are one or two measures now before the Congress, such as H. R. Bill 2788, introduced by Representative Gwyne and S-760, introduced by Senator Johnson, designed to remove the theoretical retroactive obligations such as the recent Walling ruling would imply, would, if adopted, go far towards clarifying and improving the situation.

As already stated we believe the public is beginning to realize the injustice to industry created by the passage of these measures, which were specifically and cunningly designed for political purposes, and will give full approval to the passage of remedial measures.

We urge your cooperation as a public duty and service to accomplish this end.
