May I presume upon your time to call attention to H.R. 2232, which proposes to validate by law and bureaucratic control an Executive Decree which set up the "Fair Employment Practice Commission".

To my mind, legislation of this type will create more discord and cause more unemployment than any course of action which could possibly be undertaken by the Congress.

Undoubtedly an attempt to enforce such a waw, especially by bureaucratic control, would result in widespread riots and would be the means of discouraging individual enterprise throughout the nation, particularly south of the Mason-Dixon Line.

This legislation would be an invitation to unprincipled people to practice extortion and would undoubtedly be a very effective vehicle to use as blackmail.

It is really hard to conceive of why any individual would want to open a new business enterprise when he would be, by law and bureaucratic control, denied the privilege of the selection of the personnel with which to operate.

I do hope that you will carefully note the vicious implications in this proposed legislation and use your best efforts to defeat it.
