Dear Sir:

In our opinion, the above mentioned bill is a very treacherous one and certainly delegates agencies dangerous powers of control and regimentation. This bill makes one believe that people in this country lack sufficient ability to govern themselves. Certainly if a bill of this nature is ever passed, I can see no reason why there would be any necessity of having a representation in Washington because we will have sufficient iron clad governmental rules to govern all the people. In this manner we would be free of the traditional American system of free enterprise with respect to rights, which has always been enjoyed by employers in using their own sound judgment and discretion in selecting loyal and capable employees. This bill deprives the business of the privilege of passing judgment on the employee he wishes to hire and all of our regulations in the future would be determined by the bureaus in Washington. This would appear like totalitarianism.

It is our opinion that this is one of the most unfair bills, that has ever been presented, to both employer and employee. Would certainly appreciate your checking into this bill carefully and doing everything possible to prevent its passage.
