Friend Congressman: We do not receive with our code service copies of such special acts as statutes pertaining to Indian lands, and I try to keep mine up to date in a loose leaf book, by bothering my Congressmen for them. I understand that there has just been enacted and signed by the President a bill providing that lands purchased by an Indian with his own money are not restricted in the hands of his heirs or something of the kind; and if you know of it, and there are printed copies available that you can send me without much trouble, I will appreciate one. Also from time to time I have noticed bills affecting Oklahoma Indian lands having been introduced, but have not known what has gone with them; and believe that I have not obtained any enacted since you went to Congress. If you know of any such acts passed since you have been in Congress, which you can obtain and send me with only minor inconvenience, I would appreciate receiving them at the same time as above.
