Dear Mr. Holloway:

Thank you for your letter. I was glad to hear from you.

The Osage Civilization Fund Bill is hung up in the House, with very little prospect of passage. I passed it through the House one time, and it failed in the Senate.

There is an intense opposition to Indian bills in the House, sentered around Congressman John Cochran of Missouri, and it is almost impossible to get a bill passed. I will use every effort to accomplish the passage of this bill, but it is not an easy matter. A certain group of congressmen campaign all the time against any kind of Indian bill, regardless of its merits. As I said, I get it passed one time, after the most serious effort, and I will try again.
