To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Certificate No. 2820.

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Guthrie, Oklahoma, whereby it appears that pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Congress of March 1, 1907, (34 Statutes, 1015 - 1044) full payment has been made by the Town of Pawnee, Pawnee County, Oklahoma, for the Lot one of Section thirty-two in Township twenty-two north of Range five east of the Indian Meridian, Oklahoma, containing eighty-eight and forty-three-hundredths acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Town of Pawnee, the tract of land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Town of Pawnee and to its successors forever, for the purpose, and subject to the conditions and limitations prescribed by said Act.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
