Dear Mr. Disney:

Since you have been elected to Congress and represent the people in the first Congressional district I desire to ask you a special favor on behalf of the Senior and Junior tribal Councils. I hold the position as the Recording Secretary for the Pawnee Indian Jr. Council.

I am also the official tribal corresponding Secretary for the two tribal Councils.

The favor that I desire to ask of you is that you put me on your mailing list for the Congressional Record.

While Mr. O'Connor was in Congress, he had me on his list for the Congressional Record. By getting this Record, my brother Geo. and I had the occasion to keep in touch with Senators Thomas, Linn and Representative O'Connor during the time Congress was in session.

Since I hold a responsible position on the Tribal Council I sincerely hope that you will extend me the desired favor.

I also wish to take this occasion to inquire about Mr. Hayden Lane's case. What legal steps or action has the U. S. Dist. Attorney taken toward having Mr. Lane + family ejected from the premises which they now occupy? We would insist that the Dist. Attorney bring court action or such legal proceedings in the name of the Pawnee tribe on grounds that the

2 living on tribal land. I'm  
sure that a thorough investiga-  
tion on this particular case  
will evidently show that this  
family have no deed or title  
on the particular tract of land  
occupied by them. Should this  
Lane family be permitted to  
continue to live there I would  
suggest that they be compelled  
to pay rent. However, it is the  
express will of the Pawnee tribe  
that they be unconditionally  
ejected at the earliest possible  
moment. Please let me know  
what the Dist. Attorney has done  
relative to this matter.

I'm enclosing herewith an  
oral hearing of January 11, 1981.

Certain facts concerning the title  
to the Fairgrounds, Indian  
Mission and the Agency and  
School Reserve can be obtained  
by writing to the Commissioner  
of the General Land Office at  
Washington D. C. or to the

4, U. S. Attorney General. Please  
bear in mind that the City  
of Ponca secured their good  
patent on the strength of a  
certificate which is now on  
file at Okla. City. The main  
thing to do is to get the Certif-  
icate number at the G. S. O. at  
Washington and then try  
and find out the parties in-  
volved on the Fairground deal.  
I'm quite sure that a complete  
record of the Fairground  
deal can be obtained at Okla  
City by locating the Certificate.

Please let me know about  
Mr. Lane's case, also if it will  
be possible to place me on  
your mailing list for the  
Congressional Record. With  
kindest personal regards  
from the Jr. Tribal Council,  
also hoping to hear from you  
favorably in the near future  
I beg to remain.
