My dear Mr. Chapman:

We have in our office three copies of the resolutions concerning the junior college course at Haskell Institute, Lawrence, Kansas, adopted by the Supreme Council of the Pawnee Tribe at Pawnee, Oklahoma, on July 17, 1931. One of these copies has been referred to us by the Office of the Secretary of the Interior and the other by Congressman Disney of Oklahoma.

Maskell Institute has not maintained a satisfactory junior college, as such an institution is ordinarily understood, because the school did not have the academic resources necessary or the funds to buy needed equipment. The Office plans, however, for Maskell to continue to offer advanced courses, particularly in cooperation with the University of Kansas, but it does not seem wise to attempt duplication of college and university facilities when experience has demonstrated that Indian youth are welcomed at public and private universities and colleges everywhere in the country and succeed admirably in their work at such institutions.

The Department and the Indian Office are determined to develop higher educational opportunities for Indian young people and, as you probably know. Congress has started upon a program of educational loans for Indian students. Maintaining a junior college at Haskell would hinder rather than assist this program for the Indians who can profit by higher education can best secure it in existing institutions with others of our citizens.
