When this is over with, I anticipate no bodily impairment nor extended stay in the hospital, whether the operation is or is not a success, I have in mind a trip to Washington for a short stay, and shall be pleased to confer with you on a plan of keeping our party's pledge to the Indians, as outlined in it's platforms for the years 1940 and 1944.

Meanwhile, I am opposed, as I have heretofore written you, to any claims commission as the correct method of keeping party-faith with the Indians and furnishing the mechanics necessary to having done with this so-called Indian problem, forever and ever, in the interest of all concerned, taxpayer and Indian.
