My dear Senator:

I have just had a long talk with our friend
O. K. Chandler of Miami, Oklahoma - naturally about Indians.
We went thoroughly into the provisions of the Indian bill
which he has prepared and submitted to you. I cannot see but
what this proposed legislation is the right and proper thing
to do. It certainly finishes the job as to Oklahoma Indians,
and that's what we want. Hope you can get around to intro-
ducing the bill in the Senate before adjournment and get about
40,000 copies printed and distributed in Oklahoma; let the
people know; they are ignorant on the subject, Indians and
whites; they should be informed of the injustices of the
present program.

I cannot think of anyone, white, black, red or yellow,
Democrat or Republican, in Oklahoma, being against the bill.
