

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, It having been made known to the members of the Thlopthlocco Tribal Town of the Creek Tribe of Indians, in Oklahoma, that in all likelihood, the Indian Claims Commission Bill, H. R. 4497, will be taken up on the floor of the House first week in April 1946, for consideration of the same.

WHEREAS, It is the sense and desire of the Thlopthlocco Town and its members for the passage of this bill by the Congress, as if, it does, it would help the Indians in general or who are living in your District very much, and as well as our white friends.

WHEREAS, It is the specific purpose of this resolution is to inform you that we are very much interested in this bill, this legislation and for its passage.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the business committee of the Thlopthlocco Tribal Town assembled at its community building, near Wetumka, Oklahoma, on this 27th day of March 1946, that the Thlopthlocco Tribal Town strongly in favor of this proposed legislation, and recommend for the passage of same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to our Representatives in the Congress of the United States, urging them and others interested in this legislation, for the welfare and benefit of their Indian friends, to do what they can to get the support of Members of Congress and urge them to give it their most active and favorable support for the passage of this bill.

TO CREATE AN INDIAN CLAIMS COMMISSION, TO PROVIDE FOR THE POWER, DUTIES, AND FUNCTIONS THEREOF AND OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this RESOLUTION be sent to the entire OKLAHOMA DELEGATION in the UNITED STATES CONGRESS. Also copy of this RESOLUTION be sent to the Honorable. Joseph C. O'Mahoney, Chairman of Senate Indian Affairs Committee, and the Honorable. Henry M. Jackson, Chairman of House Indian Affairs Committee.

Done this 1st day of March 1946, at Anadarko, Oklahoma at a regular monthly meeting.
