My thoughts on the present labor situation is that the unions should definitely be curbed. Higher prices along with higher salaries will not help the situation. The man can't sell and that seems to be what the unions now want. The white collar man is the one who suffers - the one who pays taxes so these laborers can collect relief in times when business is on the downgrade.

I do know that Company Unions within the plant work much better - there is never labor trouble. The Ford Motor Company had no labor trouble until the Union took charge.

My husband & I are for military conscription, are against loans to the allies without heavy collateral and are against the lower paid groups being exempt from taxes. I believe, this tends to tear down the morale, initiative and ambition in people. I've seen it.

We have lived in Oklahoma for a year now and, frankly, we believe the state could stand a good housecleaning. We heard you took over 15000 when you were home during the holidays and were favorably impressed.
