My dear Mrs. Hughes:

I have your wire suggesting that the House follow the lead of the Senate on the Byrd Amendment, and that immediate drastic action be taken on the railroad strike.

I appreciate your interest, and assure you that, so far as I am concerned, I am doing everything I can to conserve and protect the interests of the public against the labor racketeers and this Administration which has been catering to them all too long and is directly responsible for bringing about the deplorable conditions which now exist. It is the most serious economic situation that ever confronted the American people. That is the reason I am staying on the job here and not at home like many Congressmen, looking after their political campaigns.
