My dear Mrs. Du Bois:

I am just in receipt of your letter of the 12th instant, and I certainly am glad to have your views on the strike situation and how the boys feel about it.

I find your ideas very much in line with those I receive in almost every mail from people all over the country. The present Administration has things in a deplorable position. Apparently, they have been listening very attentatively to the racketeers, and disregard to a large extent the interests of the public. The public is the primary party in interest. Normally, it is by far the largest group, but it is not organized. The minority, represented by these labor racketeers, seems to have the ear of the President and that of the majority in the Senate. Fortunately, we were able to pass the Case Bill in the House, which was opposed by all the labor racketeers; and I am proud to tell you that I voted for it at every juncture.
