I have your very interesting and timely letter of the 15th instant.

I quite agree with you that something must be done in order that we may be able to salvage some of our American principles and ideals. The New Deal Party in power and with a majority in both Houses of Congress, with the President apparently trying to outdo Mr. Roosevelt in carrying forward the New Deal program, makes it extremely difficult for the minority to be as felt a factor in keeping the boat from sinking as we would like. However, I shall never quit trying and never cease fighting along these lines, as long as there is a vestige of Americanism left in the minds and hearts of our people.


Dear Sir:
