I am happy to acknowledge receipt of your letter of January 25th relative to Senator Byrd's bill seeking the alleviation of the strike-labor problem.

Just now, we are considering in the House, a bill which was advocated by the labor racketeers and the communistic and left-wing element of our country. We are also considering at the same time, a substitute bill, known as the Case Bill, which I think is a step in the right direction. I know definitely that I cannot conscientiously support the labor racketeers bill, and I think I shall enthusiastically support the Case Bill.

I might say for your information that Senator Byrd's bill and the Case bill are practically the same.
