I don't know much about the Walter Bill. It has not yet been discussed much in the House; but I shall make a careful study of it when it comes up for consideration, you may be sure.

As to H.R. 2788, the Gwynne Bill, it has been on the House Calendar several times for action, but the New Deal majority and the Administration forces always let something else take precedence. I personally am heartily in favor of the passage of this bill or some such measure. However, I do not believe that the New Deal majority will permit the passage of this Act. I suggest that you contact your own Representative in connection with the matter.

Most of these folks are thinking more of a block of votes that they think the Labor racketeers control in order to perpetuate themselves in office, than they are of the public good. You may rest assured that I am most anxious to do everything I can in the interests of the public, which is the chief group concerned.

As a matter of fact, we have laws on the statute books now which would enable the President and the state officials to handle these situations if they were inclined to do so. But it seems that this New Deal crowd has pampered and humored the Labor racketeers so much that they think they own and control the Government - and they are almost right, apparently.

In reply to your letter of May 10th protesting against the Labor situation, please understand that I agree with you. That is the reason I voted for the Case Bill and am ready to vote for any bill that will curb these racketeers.
