
Dear Sir:

I notice by the press that the President is calling for more power, and that he now wants to draft labor, women for nurses, and the so-called 4-F's.

While we are not permitted to know anything that goes on in the United States, or in Europe, it is my personal opinion that the President does not need this power, and that it is simply another move on his part to further push us into totalitarianism. If he can get the Congress to grant him power to draft women for nursing, it will only be a short while until he will want to draft them for other things.
