Dear Mr. Fisher:

I have your telegram of the 1st instant, endorsing the Wadsworth amendment to the May bill and apparently protesting the passage of the May bill without the Wadsworth amendment or some such provision being inserted in the bill.

I have very deep convictions about this bill. I voted in favor of the Wadsworth amendment, but it lost. I voted against the bill without the Wadsworth amendment, but the majority of the House voted for its passage. I am morally sure that the Senate will not pass the bill in its present form and I believe that when it is thrown into conference, an entirely different bill will emerge.

It was nice to have heard from you and I shall appreciate your suggestions and advice whenever you have anything to say that will be helpful to me.
