In reply to your wire of recent date protesting against the strike situation, please understand that I agree with you. That is the reason I voted for the Case Bill and am ready to vote for any bill that will curb these racketeers.

As a matter of fact, we have laws on the statute books now which would enable the President and the state officials to handle these situations, if they were inclined to do so. But it seems that this New Deal crowd has pampered and humored the labor racketeers so much that they think they own and control the Government -- and they are almost right, apparently.

Most of these folks are thinking more of a block of votes that they think the labor racketeers control in order to perpetuate themselves in office, than they are of the public good. You may rest assured that I am most anxious to do everything I can in the interests of the public, which is the chief group concerned.
