Dear Friend:

I am just in receipt of your letter of the 5th inst. congratulating me on my vote in support of the Case Bill, H.R. 4908, and criticizing the labor bias contained in the Wagner Act as the root of the evil in current labor trouble.

I agree with you heartily in your contentions. The indications today are that the President may veto the Case Bill, as amended by the Senate, to include the House Joint Resolution, the salient provisions of which bills were first passed by the House. I am more or less sure that the people in the Middlewest are for the provisions of the Case Bill, and would be favorable to the repeal of the Wagner Act. My people are particularly opposed to the labor bias as you termed it in the Wagner Act.

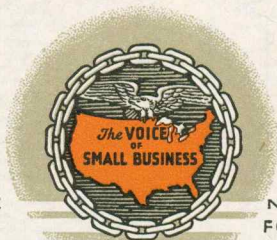
I enjoyed reading your little pamphlet, "Our American Way of Life."
