Dear Friend:

I am pleased to have your letter of the 13th instant, and to have the benefit of your views on the labor situation.

I am afraid the President hasn't kept faith with the people. The Case Bill was passed by both Houses of Congress, composed of the representatives of the people. The President vetoed this bill, and we only lacked five votes receiving the necessary two-thirds majority in the House to override his veto. The whole story seems to be that the President doesn't want any permanent legislation regarding labor passed until after the election this fall.

I appreciate very much your interest and having your views. It is always encouraging to have the benefit of the thinking of my constituents, and it is from letters such as yours that I am able to best represent the people who sent me to Congress, and the American people as a whole, in a more intelligent manner.
