Dear Friend:

I have your wire asking me to use my influence to persuade the President to sign the Case Bill, which has now been passed by both Houses of Congress, and which you fear he may veto.

What he will do is everybody's guess. I have made up my mind that if he should veto this bill, and it comes back to the Congress for a vote, I shall vote to over-ride the President's veto. I think it would perhaps carry by the required two-thirds majority in the House, but I doubt if it can be passed in the Senate over the President's veto.

I think the President is assuming a very inconsistent and indefensible position, and is being illy advised. However, I don't anticipate that my influence or advice would sway him in the least, for he seems to be listening to advisors who, in my opinion, are largely responsible for the conditions that maintain today.

You may rest assured that I shall do everything I can to enable this Case Bill to become a law.
