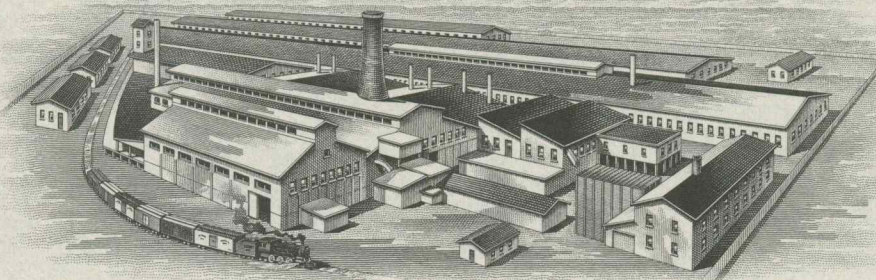

Dear Mr. Schwabe:

We are much interested in the committee composed of Senators Ball, Taft, and Smith in their recommended report relative to labor legislation, their points 1 to 6 inclusive, as outlined below:

1. A 60-day "cooling off" period with federal mediation.
2. Fact finding commissions in disputes threatening stoppage of public utilities.
3. Making unions subject to suit in federal court for violation of contracts: "wildcat" strikers to lose their status under the Wagner Act.
4. Outlawing of secondary boycotts or other union practices in restraint of trade.
5. Freeing foremen from inclusion as "employees" under the Wagner Act.
6. Outlawing of violence in labor disputes, making it unlawful to bar entrances and exits from plants or use of so-called "labor spies" by employers.

We believe legislation of this character would do a lot toward eliminating possible disaster to our country such as John L. Lewis' coal strike is now doing. Would appreciate your views on this legislation.
