CITY OF BELMONT PLANS IMPROVEMENT AT \$75,000

BELMONT, Oct. 1.—The city of Belmont is planning immediate improvements, which will include water and fire protection lines and sewerage lines to many sections of the city, to cost approximately \$75,000. Among them are water and fire protection in the residential section close to the Eagle mill, the new hosiery mill in that area now under construction, and the South Fork and Hatch Hosiery mill sections recently taken into the city limits.

The people of Belmont will be asked to approve a \$75,000 bond issue, which will in no way affect the tax rate, it is stated, because of the excellent financial condition already prevailing.

Another improvement will be an extensive street resurfacing program for all the older streets, including Poplar, Todd, Woodrow, Chronicle, Park, and parts of Central and Cedar streets.

Mullan, USN, Park Merced, San Francisco, Calif., captain of this antiaircraft cruiser, for excellent performance of duty during crucial periods before the surrender of the Japanese.

The San Diego joined the Pacific fleet in the middle of 1942, and took part in almost every operation since that time, climaxing her war role by entering Tokyo bay with American occupation forces.

SAYS U. S. SHOULD PAY ITS OWN DEBTS FIRST

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—(P)—The United States should begin thinking about paying its own debts rather than borrowing more from taxpayers to lend to England and other countries, Representative Schwabe, Republican of Oklahoma, declared today.

"Why should we be expected to tax our people and borrow further money to lend to England without interest and without any assurance of repayment?" he asked in a statement.
