Dear Friends;

I have your recent joint letter imploring me to oppose the loan to Britain.

I am happy to tell you that you are in line with the vast majority of the people of my District who have written me on this subject, and who answered the forty thousand questionnaires I sent out in December, indiscriminately, over my District.

I am also happy to tell you that, although the Administration is trying in every way and by the use of all forms of propaganda and appeals to sympathy to get Congress to appropriate money for this loan, at present Congress does not seem to be inclined to listen to such propaganda. I might say that Russia is eagerly watching the outcome of the probable loan to Britain and France is also asking for a loan. I think we will have all of them asking for loans before we know it.

There is one way I think this can be handled to test the sentiment of Americans. Let everybody who wants to lend their individual funds to Britain, Russia, France or anyone else in foreign lands do so; but don't make the American taxpayers buy the bonds and continue this deficit spending to get money to make loans to foreigners.
