My dear Mrs. Dillard:

I have your postal card of the 15th instant
requesting me to support the proposed loan to Britain.

I have received only a very few requests of that
sort. At least ninety to ninety-five per cent of the
people who have written me on this subject have urged
me to vote against such a loan.

The matter has not yet come before Congress for
action; and since its popularity is waning, or perhaps
I should say since it is becoming so unpopular, it is
doubtful if it will ever come to a vote in Congress.

I want to thank you for having written me on
this subject, and to assure you that if this measure
comes to the floor of the House for action, it will
receive my most sincere and conscientious consideration.
