I have received literally hundreds and hundreds of letters from anxious mothers and fathers and I am doing everything I can to get these boys out of school who want to come back and finish their scholastic courses. I think it is essential and important to all concerned and to the country. My position on this subject was made very plain in my recent insertion in the Congressional Record, copy of which I am sending you under separate cover, which includes a letter to the President. I have talked to the President personally about this situation and you may rest assured that I am doing everything I can to relieve these boys. I am even introducing a bill in Congress which will permit them to come back and finish their school work.
