Hon. Paul Stewart, of the 3rd District had a Bill that he has introduced a few days since that provides that a person 60 years of age or older is entitled and should receive a Pension of \$40.00 per mont direct from the Government and the qualifications that are required are that they must be a citizen of the United States and more than 60 years of age.

I would like very much to see this Bill become a Law very soon for it would give to thousands the substance which would aid them in living more comfortably than they are at present living and thus give to them that mellow long evening of the setting sun of their life time and the joy that would be created by this means cannot be measured in dollars and when we know just how little it would cost the Government to exercise the **Grant of Power**, under the Constitution and pay that sum to these **aged citizens** and then the smiles and the joy it would bring to them should be a sufficient consideration to secure the support of every member of Congress to vote for its passage.
