**Tulsa Sales Tax Payments
Jumps Along With State**

OKLAHOMA CITY, Sept. 6.—(AP)—Oklahomans paid \$1,778,684 in sales taxes in July, an increase of 12.34 per cent over the same month in 1944.

Collections by counties, compared with July, 1944, included: Comanche, 41,068 and 38,801; Garfield, 4,077 and \$41,064; Muskogee, \$58,3 and \$49,706; Oklahoma, \$390,7 and \$361,395; Okmulgee, \$29,1 and \$22,341; Pottawatomie, \$31,2 and \$27,539; Tulsa, \$291,036 and \$27,491; Washington, \$27,085 and \$2,286.

**Sales Tax Collections
in Jump Over August, '44**

OKLAHOMA CITY, Sept. 6.—(AP)—August sales tax collections in Oklahoma increased 12.34 per cent over the same month last year, the state tax commission reported today. The month's collections this year totaled \$1,778,684 while the take in August, 1944, was \$1,583,352.
