Dear Congressman Schwabe:

Your attention is directed to Bill H. R. 3694 now pending in the House. This Bill was introduced July 5, 1945 by the Honorable Mr. Hartley, ranking Republican member of the Committee on Patents. We are advised the Honorable Mr. Boykin, ranking Democratic member and Chairman of the Committee, is favorable to the Bill.

If passed, this Bill will effect an important improvement in the patent laws, and should eliminate considerable present uncertainty with respect to validity of patents occasioned by the theories of the courts in recent years.

This Bill adds to present Section 4886 of the patent laws the following:

"Patentability of inventions and discoveries, including discoveries due to research, and improvements thereof, shall be determined objectively by the nature of the contribution to the advancement of the art, and not subjectively by the nature of the mental process by which the invention or discovery, or the improvement thereof, may have been accomplished."

We respectfully request your active support for the prompt enactment of this legislation. We believe it will be very helpful.
