I have your postal card of recent date relative to extension of the term of patents where it is shown that operations under patents were made impossible on account of the war.

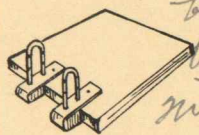
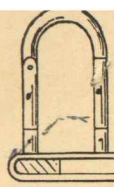
I don't know to which bill you have reference, but I assure you that I am in sympathy with your situation, and if something can be worked out along the lines you suggest, perhaps it will be done.
